Catering balances

We would like to thank you for your patience whilst our tills have been inoperable. We have been working closely with our IT support team to resolve this and have been informed that we will receive new operating tills. In the meantime, we have implemented a manual system to track what students are purchasing each day and these charges will be added to your child's online lunch account, ParentPay. We will keep you updated on an instalment date for the new tills, but for now, please can we kindly ask that you ensure your child's account has sufficient funds to cover their meals during the period of 19th March to 23rd

May 2025. As a general rule, a lunchtime meal deal costs £2.50, or £12.50 per week. This means your current balance could amount to £92.50. This does not include any break time snacks, or additional purchases during lunchtime. For any students in receipt of free school meals, allocated balances have already been removed, so that families can see if extras have been purchased. We understand that this situation may cause some inconvenience and we appreciate your patience and cooperation while we work to restore full functionality. Up to date balances can be obtained from the Operations Manager, should you wish to know this in advance. Thank you for your understanding.

We hope you manage to get a break and we look forward to welcoming our children back on Monday 2nd June 2025!
