### **History Club Talk Brings School's Past to Life!**

On Thursday 17th July, Mr Richards, Head of our brilliant History Club, delivered a fascinating talk to members of the Prees Historical Association at Prees Village Hall. It was an evening filled with curiosity, community, and student voice. Meeting every Thursday in Room 4, our History Club students have been researching the roots of our school's name and buildings, and their findings truly impressed the audience. Mr Richards shared the club's discoveries about Sir John Talbot, 1st Earl of Shrewsbury, and his descendant Rector Sir John

Talbot, who donated £200 in 1550 to help establish the earliest form of our school. The students explored these figures' legacy and their unique link to our school's history. The second half of the presentation showcased findings uncovered with the support of Historic England, tracing who lived on our current school site using the 1911 census. Even those students who couldn't attend were recognised for their incredible contributions. The Historical Association was so impressed, they've already invited the students to return next year to share even more

discoveries. Huge congratulations to everyone involved – it was a proud moment for our school!

### Yesterday's Colour Run was nothing short of spectacular! Students from across the school came together, bursting with


